



**Re: Electrical System Rebuild for Residents on Etude Drive, Minotola Avenue,
Justine Drive, Cambrett Drive, Hermitage Road, Goreway Drive and Dorcas Street.**

Dear Resident:

Please be advised that Enersource Hydro Mississauga will be making important investments in the electrical infrastructure that supplies power to your neighbourhood.

A rebuild of the electrical distribution system is scheduled to begin in December 2016 and will last approximately five months. Work will include the replacement and relocation of the following: old, decaying wood poles with new and taller concrete poles, powerlines, transformers and associated hardware. To meet current Electrical Safety Authority and Canadian Standards Association requirements, it may be necessary to add new poles and associated hardware to locations where none currently exist.

Trimming will be required on trees that are near our electrical equipment. Trees will be pruned to ensure that a minimum three-year growth clearance and safe distance is maintained from the main powerlines. Dead, defective and structurally weak branches may also require removal.

It is our intention to carry out this work with as little inconvenience to you as possible. However, during this period of construction, there may be some road access limitations while crews are working. Occasional power interruptions will also be required as crews transfer powerlines. Notification of any planned power interruptions will be delivered to you in advance.
