STAY SAFE: AVOID DIGGING YOURSELF INTO TROUBLE

April 1, 2016 – (MISSISSAUGA, Ontario) – Friday, April 1st marks the beginning of ‘Dig Safe Month’ and Enersource is reminding everyone to take the appropriate safety steps before beginning outdoor projects.

When digging is required, customers and contractors are reminded to do the following in advance of any work:

- At least one week before you dig, contact Ontario One Call’s free, 24-hour a day service at 1-800-400-2255 or by visiting www.on1call.com.
- Provide your location, project scope and expected timelines.
- Ontario One Call will notify the utilities with underground equipment in your area. If there are any buried cables or wires on your property, they will be clearly marked for you.
- Follow the instructions provided to avoid personal injury or damage to underground equipment.

Enersource will show its support of the ‘Dig Safe Month’ campaign, by flying a ‘Dig Safe’ flag throughout April at both of its locations.
