By simply providing the details of your project through their free, 24-hour a day service, Ontario One Call will notify the utilities with underground facilities in your area. If

there are any buried cables or wires on your property, they will be clearly marked before you dig.

New Electricity Rates in Effect May 1st

On April 16, 2014, the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) announced changes to electricity commodity rates.

Effective May 1, 2014, all customers in Ontario on Time-of-Use ("TOU") rates, will be charged as follows:

- Off-peak (7 p.m. to 7 a.m. weekdays, weekends & statutory holidays) = 7.5¢/kWh (an increase of 0.3¢)
- Mid-peak (7 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays) = 11.2¢/kWh (an increase of 0.3¢)
- On-peak (11 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays) = 13.5¢/kWh (an increase of 0.6¢)

Enersource purchases the electricity that we deliver to our customers at market prices and earns no margin on the sale of the commodity. Local electricity distribution companies, like Enersource, recover costs through the delivery portion of electricity bills. This accounts for approximately 20% of the total bill for a typical residential customer.

The changes determined by the Ontario Energy Board will cost the average Ontario residential customer who uses 800 kWh of electricity per month, approximately \$2.83 more on the "Electricity" line of their bill.

Customers in Ontario who are still being billed using tiered-pricing will be charged as follows:

Effective May 1, 2014, two-tiered rates on the Regulated Price Plan (RPP) will increase to:

- 8.6¢/kWh for the first 600 kWh (residential only) consumed each month (an increase of 0.3¢); and
- •10.1¢/kWh above that (an increase of 0.4¢).

Note: The threshold for small businesses stays at 750 kWh/month all year.

The Ontario Clean Energy Benefit (OCEB) which calculates a 10% reduction in your electricity bill for consumption of up to 3,000 kWh monthly will continue.

*NOTE: If you purchase your electricity from an energy retailer, you will continue to pay electricity rates and charges in accordance with your retail energy contract.
